May we, too, embrace and live out the words she spoke at Cana and in our private and public lives "Do whatever He tells (us)". Amen.

**3rd luminous mystery - Jesus Announces the Coming of the Kingdom** Heavenly Father, You gave to us Your only Son to prepare for us a path to salvation. May we follow that way to Your heavenly Kingdom through lives of purity, modesty, and chastity and so show our love for Your Son, Jesus the Christ. Amen.

**4th luminous mystery - The Transfiguration of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ** Come Holy Spirit and transform our fallen nature so that we may avoid the near occasions of sin and refrain from giving scandal to the innocent. May our thoughts be of You, our conversations holy, and our actions bespeak the dignity of our bodies. Amen

**5th luminous mystery - The Institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper**

Most Blessed Trinity, the disciples gathered together in the Cenacle to witness and celebrate the miracle of Transubstantiation whereby ordinary bread and wine became the Body and Blood of Our Lord by which even today we are fed, nourished, and sustained in our resolve to give Glory to God in the Highest and peace to His people on earth. Amen.

### Prayer of Deliverance

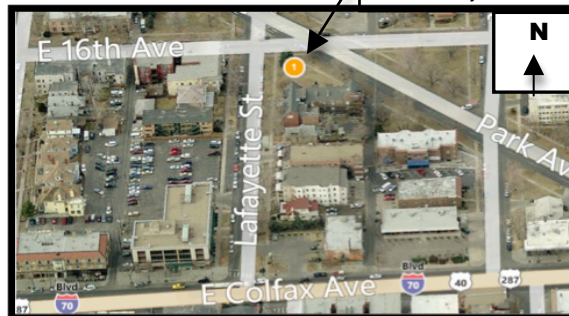
